

Guillermo GüémezDeputy Governor, Banco de México

Guillermo Güémez was named Deputy Governor of Banco de México in 1995 and ratified on December 2002 for another eight year term. Currently he is Member of the Board of the National Banking and Securities Commission and of Casa de Moneda. From 1995 to 2006 he was Member of the Board of the National Insurance Commission.

Before joining México's Central Bank, Mr. Güémez was President of the Executive Committee in Grupo Azucarero México and Vice Chairman of the Board of Grupo de Embotelladoras Unidas, S.A. de C.V. and Co-Chairman of the North American Committee and Board Member of Home Mart, S.A. de C. V.

From 1991 to 1993 served on the Mexican Business Coordinating Council for the North American Free Trade Agreement ("NAFTA") in the capacity of Executive Director.

In 1974 he began working with Banco Nacional de México, S.A. (Banamex) in various capacities including Manager for foreign currency funding and international credits up to 1978, Executive Vice President of international treasury and foreign exchange, exchange controls and Ficorca from 1982 to 1986, Executive Vice President for International Products and during 1979 to 1981 was responsible for the establishment of Banamex branch in London, Founder and President of Euromex Casa de Cambio and Euroamerican Capital Corporation from 1986 to 1990, also served as Member of the Board of the Institute of International Finance and Board Member and Chairman of the Executive Committee of the International Mexican Bank, Ltd.

In 1973 was assistant of the representative of Bank of America (Mexico).

From 1971 to 1973 was Treasurer and Financing Manager of Cementos Guadalajara.

From 1964 to 1971 he worked at Empresa Constructora Industrial, S.A. in the construction of Puebla-Orizaba and México-Querétaro highway as well as in Guadalajara and Monterrey airports.

Guillermo Güémez is a Civil Engineer from the National University of México and has a Master of Science degree from Stanford University.
